About The University

he year 1916 marked the beginning of a new era in the history of Women's higher education in India, when Dr. Dhondo Keshav Karve started the Indian Women's University at Hingne, near Poona with just four students. In a society governed by age old customs and outdated attitudes towards women, an Institution of this type was bound to face social and economic difficulties. Fortunately, Sir Vithaldas Thackersey impressed by the pioneering work of Dr. Karve, made a contribution of Rs. 15 lakhs to the Institution to commemorate the memory of his mother. Thus the vision of Shri Maharashi Karve and the foresight of Sir Vithaldas Thackersey led to the establishment of the first exclusive University of Women in India in 1916, named after the great benefactor's revered mother, Nathibai as the Shrimati Nathibai Damodar Thackersey Women's University popularly known as S.N.D.T. University.

The headquarters of the University was shifted to Bombay in 1936. The University con-

tinued to grow, providing higher education to more and more women. In 1951, the University received statutory recognition and since then its progress has been accelerated. With faculties of Arts, Social Science, Fine Arts, Home Science, Education and Library Science, the University has become a unique centre of higher education not only in our country but in the world. It has today a total of 11 conducted and 22 affiliated colleges in Maharashtra and Gujarat, offering 36 courses in Arts, Science, Commerce, Home Science, Nursing, Pharmacy, Library Science and several other technical and semi-technical fields. There are 38 Postgraduate departments and two research establishments to carry out research. It has also launched the open University and Correspondence Course Programmes.

The Department of women's studies and P.V. Polytechnic for women which has been adjudged as the Best Polytechnic in Maharashtra are some of the unique institutions of the university. Student enrolment has

well crossed the 46,000 mark

The university having achieved national so international fame today is marching the to establish the Institute of Technology Management studies in the 21st centur While taking these strides, the University maintained its experimental focus by proing instruction in the mother tongue, by the mitting and encouraging external studen and by providing professional and job-an ented courses to meet the needs of women in the fast changing world. The University further plans to focus attention on inter-deciplinary and inter-departmental programmes drawing resources from its various departments. The University is active involved in Urban and Rural extension programmes and has thus extended its services to community for the upliftment of women. The S.N.D.T. University has commendably lived upto its chosen motto "An enlightened woman is a source of infinite power".

SNDT Gompletes 80



The 80th Anniversary celebrations of SNDT Women's University and S.N.D.T. Arts & Commerce College, Pune was held at the Pune Campus on July 5, '96 the foundation day of the University.

On this occasion Shri Dattaji Rane the Hon. Minister for Higher Education. Govt. of Maharashtra was the chief guest. Shri Shashikant Sutar, Hon. Minister for Agriculture and

Guardian Minister for Pune District and Smt. Kamal Vyavahare, the newly elected Mayor of Pune who is SNDT Alumni, were also present to grace the occasion.

The function commenced with the inauguration of the new extension wing of the Arts and Commerce College, the first Institute of the University. On the occasion Shri Dattaji Rane the Hon. Minister paid tributes to the founder, Maharshi Karve, and garlanded his photograph. Dr. Varghese, the vice-chancellor, welcomed the guests and stressed the need to keep up with the changing times and to look beyond the academic world to external sources and institutions to bring about timely and beneficial development in the education field.

She also suggested to the Government to encourage Industrial and Commercial enterprises willing to help the educational institutions by extending their services and facilities to the students with tax benefits and exemption. She pointed out that the aim of Women's education is not only the upliftment of a section of society neglected for a long time but to ensure a brighter future for the society as a whole. If Human resources are counted as one of the major resources in a growing economy such as India, then the education and therefore economic upliftment of half of the nations human resources i.e. the women was of prime importance.

Shri Shashikant Sutar the guardian Minister stressed the need for Agriculture education and research for women. Dr. Hemlata Parasnis, the Registrar of the university gave a brief account of the university, its unique features and the challenges of the university.

On the occasion the Ex-students of the college, Smt. Gangutai Patwardhan, 96 years old and Smt. Kamal Vyavahare, the Mayor of Pune were felicitated. NEWSLINE was released by Hon. Minister Shri Rane.

RANE emphasises vocational training

PUNE. July 5: While the city witnessed several functions organised to felicitate SSC toppers. State Education Minister, Datta Rane, today emphasised the need to promote vocational education which alone, he felt, would help students, particularly those from rural areas, to earn their livelihood.

He was delivering the presidential address at a function organised to mark the closing ceremony of the 80th anniversary celebrations of the SNDT College of Arts and Commerce, off Karve Road here this morning. Guardian minister of Pune, Shashikant Sutar, Mayor Kamal Vyavahare and the Vice Chancellor of SNDT Women's University. Mumbai, Dr. Mariamma Varghese were chief guests at the function.

While lauding the sincere efforts of SNDT university and several other educational institutes which have and are planning to open colleges in the rural area, Rane, however, opined that conventional education would not help rural students.

He disclosed that over 300 applications from various educational institutes who wish to open branches in rural areas to impart higher education remain pending. However, the State has decided to go slow over these proposals, he said arguing that it was useless to open an additional college for higher education.

To justify his claim, Rane pointed out that several students who have secured Bachelors' degrees in arts and agriculture are often seen knocking on the doors of co-operative banks for jobs. Their other option is to teach, and, there are hardly any jobs left in the teaching profession", he added.

He called upon educational institutes to introduce such courses which would help students acquire technical and professional skills, and added that the State was planning to encourage such "need-based colleges" in rural areas.



NEW KIT TO DETECT ADULTERANTS DEVELOPED BY SNDT

he home science department of the SNDT University, which has just completed an extensive study on food adulteration, is trying to create public awareness on the subject as well as enable people to test their consumer products. To this end, the Council for Fair Business Practices (CFBP), SNDT Testing Centre, has been set up on the university campus at Juhu. The centre has also devised a home kit to detect food adulteration, which the consumer can buy for as little as Rs 250.

"This kit enables the housewife to easily check for herself the purity of often used ingredients at home," says A.V.Patankar, Honorary director of the CFBP laboratory. "for example, mustard or groundnut oil is often adulterated with pungam oil. To check this, a person can add two drops of oil to a solution that is part of the kit. If it turns canary yellow or orangish, it indicates the presence of the adulterant."

"Similarly, chilli powder is often adulterated with sawdust and colour," he says, adding, "if one adds a liberal dash of it to a glass of water, the sawdust will float and the added colour will colour the water. Or, when a sample of coffee adulterated with chicory is mixed in a mug of cold water, the cofee will float while the chicory will sink, staining the water brown."

All these information is in a booklet that comes along with the kit.


The QC Circle movement at SNDT takes shapes

The Maharashtra Governor, Dr. P.C. Alexander, today observed that formal education alone may not succeed in empowering women unless it created an attitudinal change in the society.

He was speaking after laying the foundation stone for the department of Post Graduate Studies and Research (PGSR) centre of the here.

education, as it is understood today, may not give women their due, Besides an attitudinal change in society, the curriculum in schools and colleges also needed to be changed, he added.

school books laid stress upon the ideals of dignity and respect to women, Even before one talks of equality, these basic led, he added.

Education, being a learning process,

was also an "unlearning process", Dr Alexander sald. Even educated parents were not free from the shackles of old beliefs. Students get their degrees but their attitudes remain unchanged he lamented.

Teachers, too, are to blame, because while they teach the ideals of liberty and equality as espoused by philosophers like Rousseau and Locke, they themselves have not assimilated the true spirit of these ideals, Dr Alexander said, Teachers should be trained to instil in the

SNDT University Pune minds of their students the values enshrined in the Constitution.


Women themselves are the Dr Alexander said that greater prepetrators of cruelty on other women. On an average, 17 women die each day in dowry-related case and it is women who are behind these crimes, he observed.

Dr Alexander lamented that women's education in the country had not made much progress even after 50 years of Independence. Although the absolute number of Dr Alexander said few women students had gone up, the figure, in actual terms, was far less in proportion to the population of the country, he added.



Aruna Desai - A Committed Social Worker

runa Desai Completed 50 years of service as an educationist and a reputed social worker. Niece of late Smt. Pushpaben Mehta, a renowned social worker of Gujarat, graduated in 1947 and dedicated to the cause education women's Surendranagar and established Vikas Vidyalaya. Recently she was awarded Nari Ratna award by Citizens of Surendranagar residing in Mumbai. She was interviewed by another social Worker Jayantika Jayanthhai regarding S.N.D.T. Women's University.

Some of the excerpts from her interview are quoted here:

Qs. When you look back, how do you feel about the university & the curriculum?

Ans. When I was studying at L.U.

College at Ahmedabad during 1944-1947, the only course available was Arts. It was useful, in the sense that physiology, psychology, sociology were compulsory and the voluntary subjects were few. The education through mother tongue was helpful. Our University had then accepted the principle of ATKT, in order to encourage women and to save one year. All ex-students are actively working in the field of Women's education and doing social work for upliftment of less fortunate sisters. Now the University has expanded and branched out in so many other disciplines like Commerce, Home Science, Pharmacy, Nursing and Polytechnic.

Qs. Do you think that a seperate university for women is still necessary in these changed times?

Ans. Yes, still many parents are not sending their daughters to coeducational institutes. Secondly, it is a safe place, where the girls can study without any kind of fear. Thirdly, higher education is possible for few, you know that still 60% of our sisters are illiterate.

Qs. Would you like to suggest any new courses for our University?

Ans. Yes, I would very much like to suggest that our university should start a course in social work. Bombay & Baroda Univeristies run these courses in English medium. If our university starts a course for M.S.W., It would be very meaningful and useful. Even now most of social workers in Gujarat are SNDT graduates. If university starts this course, the society will get trained social workers which will be a boon.

On eve of their retirement Cherished memories of our dedicated faculty

My obligations to

On the resplendent day of my fruitful retirement on November 30, 1996, my memories flash almost four decades back when I started my career at the University in my twenties. No experience, no knowledge of university office work, no known friends in the office, I ventured to start my life, with high dreams and soaring aspirations, but with confidence to put my heart and soul in the mission, — in the clerical work.

Infused with the spirit of learning with zeal and sincerity, I gradually studied rules and regulations, governing private/external students, enrolling for the higher studies at different levels.

In the beginning, it was all dry and lifeless but there as the time rolled on, it gave me interest and my work became lively, under the guidance of my immediate administrative heads.

As the years rolled on, I was promoted from one cadre to the next, transferring from one Department to the other Department and so my responsibility began to vary and multiply, which initiated me to be more devoted and diligent in the execution of manifold work of multiple dimension. Regularity and punctuality wedded to my every day work, coupled with the spirit of not looking at the clock or the calendar.

It was then a home, away from home, when my officers showed paternal feelings for me, treating me as a member of their family. They had imbibed in me the art of being exact, accurate, systematic, clarity of expression, justification for making exception to the rule always to be impartial, confident, truthful, loyal, devoted and creative in everything new and original.

It was my proud privilege to be actively associated with the Examination work, of all Faculties, under the guidance of the Deputy Registrar Shri I.N. Kaji, who placed implicit trust and confidence in me and as he often even now tells others that I had proved worthy of it on all scores.

My duties in the Correspondence Section gave me an opportunity to come in touch with three generations, now many of them being grand-mothers. It was a great pleasure to encourage them, guide them, solve their problems, and be sympathetic and humane towards them, with all humility and humanity.

I was fortunate to have beheld the Golden Jubilee and the Platinum Jubilee of my Alma Mater. I have actively participated in the manifold work of each of the Convocations.

There was a flash in my eyes and a smile on my lips when I received a word of appreciation from galaxies of Vice-Chancellors, Registrars and other officers at the Univeristy on all occasions. My heart over-whelmed with unbounded ecstacy.

My day-to-day work accorded me an opportunity to come in touch with an active assistance from the Principals and Faculty Members in the Conducted Colleges and Affiliated Colleges, spread over the States of Gujarat and Maharashtra.

I cannot refrain myself from mentioning two luminaries of the University, Dr. D.K. Karve and Dr. Smt. Premlila V. Thackersey, who were the pivotal figures for the growth and development of the University. Their successive followers having taken up their mission and further enshrined them in all its magnitude.

Time has rolled so fast that I feel as if everything flashes before my inward eye and I still live in the past and my future shall always glow in the sweet memories of all my associates and in my unqualified love for the University, to whom all, I shall ever remain indebted for sucess in my life.

evaluation workshop and was asked to give lectures. The particle pants were all well experienced and had put in more service than I had so naturally I was a little but tense. Unfortunately my mother-inclaw was admitted to the hospital for cancer treatment and was to be operated the day after my lecture was arranged, since this happened so suddenly that I could not prepare or postpone my lectures and I was under terific stress and strain.

I managed to take the lectures and as soon as I came out of the class, a tender touch was on my back, it was Shakuntalaben's hand patting me which revealed the words 'well done' I retired on August 31, 1996. Dr. Varghese. Vice-Chancellor had some urgent work on that day but she along with Dr. Parasnis called me the previous day for tea and offered a beautiful momento.

I wish SNDT will prosper in Twenty First century under the able guidance of a very dynamic Vice-Chancellor Dr. Varghese.
