Report of IBM/ACE GURUKUL '99

A Grand International Career Guidance and Education Fair - IBM/ACE GURUKUL '99 was organised from 26th January to 29 January 1999 at Andheri Sports Complex. The inauguration of IBM/ACE GURUKUL '99 was held at Nehru Centre Auditorium on 26th January 1999. Shri Manohar Joshi, Hon. Chief Minister of Maharashtra, while inaugurating the fair congratulated S.N.D.T. Women's University and other sponsors for organising such a fair. He said that actually such an information fair should have been organised by the Government. He appreciated Dr. Mariamma Varghese and the S.N.D.T. Women's University for taking up the responsibility on themselves. The different components of IBM/ACE GURUKUL '99 were Aptitude Testing, Personal Counselling, Comprehensive Lectures, Seminars on Vision 2020, International seminar on foreign education viz. Australian, Italian,

French, British and U.S. Education, apart from the information provided at about 80 stalls at the exhibition. Nearly 15000-20000 people visited the exhibition. 150-200 students belonging to age group of 14-17 underwent Aptitude Testing and 400-500 students belonging to the age group of 16-25 attended the Oral and Vocational Counselling sessions.

Two public Debates - one on the motion "Privatisation of Education will Make a Modern India" on 27th January 1999, which was inaugurated by Shri Pramod Navalkar, Hon. Kadam of Bhawan's Collage and Shahzadi Hakim of Anjuman-Islam.

CENTRE FOR CANADIAN STUDIES



She is survived by her husband, a daughter and a son MAY HER SOUL REST IN PEACE.



The agenda for the Youth Parliament were:


